Merit Scholarships at the Woodstock School of Art, Inc. will be awarded on a limited basis to deserving students who demonstrate the following:

- Financial need.
- Commitment to one's craft or an earnest desire to improve skills.
- An ability to attend all classes within the award period.

Monitor Scholarships at the Woodstock School of Art, Inc. will be awarded on a limited basis to deserving *advanced* students who are able to fulfill the requirements of a Merit Scholarship plus the following:

- The ability and desire to assist one's instructor in classroom activity, including setup, breakdown, etc.
- Recording class attendance and reporting same to office.

Work Exchange Scholarships at the Woodstock School of Art, Inc. will be awarded on a limited basis to deserving students who are able to fulfill the requirements of a Merit Scholarship and agree to the following:

- Students will work on an hour for hour exchange for class time.
- Work will be completed in a timely manner.
- Students will keep a time record of classes attended and work completed.

Please note - All scholarship students are required to call the office if an absence cannot be avoided.
