We will paint together in this exciting course. I will thoroughly demonstrate materials and usage and discuss with you all aspects of painting. Both beginner and advanced artists will greatly broaden their knowledge of the glories of paint. If you are a beginner, you are at the start of a marvelous adventure. If you do not have all the materials, I will assist you. **Kindly note: if you cannot be present at every live session, WSA supplies you with a link to the class that allows you to view it for 2 weeks.**

We will be starting a painting together in class and you may continue during the week for a Homework assignment. Homework is not mandatory. If you desire a review of your work, we have a Dropbox for homework. This adds intrigue as we can see each other's creations every week. You do not need a personal Dropbox account. WSA will supply you with a link and we can assist you with uploading your work.

NOTE: In advance of the class kindly prepare one or more of the following based upon your preference. If you prefer to work in one medium over another, for example, acrylic over oil paint, you may just use the materials of the medium you prefer.

- 1. Paper for acrylic:** Any color paper. It is fun to use a sampling of colored papers. As acrylic is water based, a watercolor paper is advantageous. However, you may apply gesso to a non-watercolor paper in order to protect it.
- 2. Cardboard:** Is a marvelous surface to work upon. I will show you its magic!
- 3. Oil:** Treated Paper for Oil, Canvas Paper, Board, Raw or Treated Canvas/Linen.
- 4. Mylar or Vellum**

Tools for Painting:

No need for fancy brushes, assorted sized house paint brushes are perfect.

A Few Pencils

1 Small or Medium Sponge

Acrylic Paint, Oil Sticks, Oil Pastels or Oil Paint

Oil Paint Medium and Thinner of your choice.

Palette Paper or Freezer Wax Paper for Acrylic/Oil Paint

Paper Towels, cloth rags or Baby Wipes
